

## Family Re-union with Foreigners

- Travel Medical Insurance (Get the peace of mind you need on your travels, with insurance made simple, for more [click here](#))
- Signed visa application form
- Applicant's valid passport/travel document
- Applicant's photo – 02 copies (35 \* 45 mm)
- Residence documents – valid residence permits/equivalents (in cases where applicants reside in a country that is different from the country of their nationality/citizenship)
- Original + Copy of the letter of Invitation.
- Proof that the applicant is a holder of (or is entitled to benefit from) a valid medical/travel insurance policy to cover Ukraine and the period of stay (the policy should provide a minimum of €30 000 or equivalent coverage)  
**The policy must be valid on the territory of Ukraine. If the territorial coverage of the policy is indicated as Europe/Schengen/etc. and Ukraine is not mentioned, such a policy is not acceptable.**
- According to current legislation, to obtain a long-term visa (in particular, category D-04), the applicant must provide a bank statement for the last three months as part of the required documentation, confirming the availability of sufficient financial resources. The minimum account balance must be equivalent to at least 7,600 US dollars - calculated at a rate of 80 dollars per day for 90 days of stay, plus an additional 5 days to cover any unforeseen expenses.

If the balance of funds in the applicant's account is below the required minimum, the visa will be denied on the grounds of insufficient financial support. In such cases, the company inviting the applicant for employment may submit a letter of guarantee confirming its obligations to cover the foreign national's expenses related to their stay in Ukraine and subsequent departure from the country

**Together with the bank statement, applicants must submit one page of their original Cheque book indicating the bank account number, bearing the bank's stamp and the signature of the responsible bank officer.**

- Copy of a Marriage Certificate on registration of marriage between the applicant and a national/citizen of Ukraine accompanied by a copy of that Ukrainian citizen's internal passport. Marriage certificates issued by foreign countries should be apostilled (legalized) and translated into Ukrainian as well as duly certified.02 Passport Photocopies with photocopy of previous (Ukraine, USA, UK, Schengen and Australia) visa.
- Birth Certificate if child is Minor.
- Original Notarized NOC for the Children below 18 years.
- One of the following:
  - i) Document(s) confirming that the applicant is a family member of a foreigner/stateless person residing in Ukraine upon a temporary residence permit accompanied by a copy of that foreigner/stateless person's temporary residence permit as well as proof of that foreigner/stateless person's sufficient funds to cover applicant's expenses in Ukraine (e.g. Original 03 months updated Bank statements with original Bank stamp and Sign with minimum balance of USD2500, bank cards along with current/savings account balance statements provided the bank cards can be cashed in Ukraine, cash in Ukrainian hryvnia/other convertible currency, accommodation arrangements etc.). Certificates issued by foreign countries should be apostilled (legalized) and translated into Ukrainian as well as duly certified, Duly Notarized Sponsorship Letter with Original Stamp and Sign  
Or
  - ii) Document confirming that the applicant is a family member of a foreigner/stateless person who has been granted refuge/temporary protection in Ukraine. Certificates issued by foreign countries should be apostilled (legalized) and translated into Ukrainian as well as duly certified.
- Can be applied for Husband/Wife and Children below 18 years of age.

Please note: Birth and Marriage Certificates need to be translated in Ukrainian language and notarized from Ukraine or Embassy of Ukraine. Translation from Indian translators is not acceptable.

Please note that applicants might be asked for additional documents by Ukraine's visa officers (e.g. return flight tickets and other documents confirming applicants' circumstances (to be defined by Ukraine's visa officers of the relevant Embassy/Consulate General)
