| "Nulla Osta" | Original and photocopy to be collected (This is valid for 6 months and the visa can be issued only if the nulla osta is valid) | |
| Birth Certificates | <p>For minors joining parent/s in Italy</p> <p>_ Birth Certificate of the child/children in original, issued by the Registrar of Births and Deaths, sub-Registrar, Tehsildar or Grama Panchayat, clearly mentioning the registration number. To be notarised and duly validated by the Under Secretary, Home Department, apostilled by the Ministry of External Affairs/New Delhi and translated into the Italian language. The translation should be legalised by the Consulate General.</p> | |
| Marriage Certificate | <p>_ Original Marriage Certificate of the parents, issued by the Registrar of Marriage, Sub-Registrar, Tehsildar or Grama Panchayat, clearly mentioning the registration number. To be notarised and duly validated by the Under Secretary of the Home Department of the relevant/competent State Government & apostilled by the Ministry of External Affairs/ New Delhi. This Certificate should be translated into the Italian language by a recognized translator. The certificate and the translation should be legalized by this Consulate General.</p> | |
| One and the same certificate | <p>Original and photocopy to be collected, in case of any discrepancy in names. This has to be issued by the competent Tehsildar or Grama Panchayat, notarised, legalised by Home Department, apostilled by the Ministry of External Affairs/New Delhi and translated into the Italian language. The translation should be legalised by the Consulate General.</p> <p>All names must correspond on the nulla osta, passport and birth/marriage certificates.</p> | |

| For Minors Travelling | <p>a] No Objection (In case Minor is Travelling with any one Parent or unaccompanied) Affidavit from the parent in India stating that he/she has no objection to the travel of the minor and the affidavit has to be notarised and legalised by the competent Home Department stamp.</p> <p>The consent of the parent in Italy is understood since the nulla osta will bear the names of both parent and child/children.</p> | |
| | <p>b] No Objection (In case Minor is Travelling with a Third Party) Affidavit from the parent in India stating that he/she has no objection to the travel of the minor with a Third Party, mentioning name and attaching a copy of the passport and visa or stay permit of the said Third Party). The affidavit has to notarised and legalised by the competent Home Department.</p> <p>The parent in Italy has to make a similar self-declaration with a copy of his/her stay permit and passport.</p> | |
| | <p>c] Minors traveling with both the parents do not require an affidavit of consent, provided that the names of both parents appear on the said minor's passport</p> | |
| Passport copy and Residence permit of the Invitee | Photocopy with observations if any on the passport. | |
| Passport copy of the applicant and other parent | Photocopy | |
| Air Ticket | Reservation printout of one way ticket | |
